Hello and welcome....

to your Parish Council newsletter, the first issue of 2012. Since the last issue in November, the Parish Council has completed the budget process to set the precept for the next financial year and you will have already received your Shropshire Council Tax statement showing this. You may have noticed a small increase in the precept, equivalent to 2p per week per household, which is entirely due to Shropshire Council passing down administration costs to the Parish Council so that Shropshire can show no increase in its Council Tax demand. The finances of your Parish Council are forecast to finish this year slightly better than budget and a full explanation of this year's expenditure and next year's budget will be included in the Annual Parish Report which will be issued in a couple of months. I'm sure that when you received your Council Tax information you will have checked and seen that the precept per household in this Parish, in comparison with other Parish and Town Councils in Shropshire, shows good value.

Previous newsletters have given a full explanation of the Parish Council's approach to the Planning Application to extend the life of the land fill site operated by Tudor Griffiths at Colemere. In January, Shropshire Council granted permission for the site to continue tipping operations until 2030 but, as a result

of pressure by the Parish Council and the residents of Colemere, a number of conditions are being applied, including the establishment of a liaison group of interested parties, and fencing to improve rubbish control. We are waiting Shropshire Council's confirmation that all the appropriate licences are in place which will enable the liaison group to commence, and both the Parish Council and Colemere residents will be represented.

In Spring 2013 there are to be local elections and this is for Parish Councillors as well as Shropshire Councillors. If you are considering becoming a Councillor, now is the time to start the process by coming along to the Council meetings, to see what happens. Of course, you can keep informed as well by visiting our web site.

Finally, everyone knows that it is the Queen's Diamond Jubilee this year and there will be celebrations around the world to mark the occasion. These celebrations include here a service in Welshampton Church at 3pm on Sunday 3rd June followed by tea on the vicarage lawns, and in Colemere beside the mere, a Jubilee party on Monday 4th June. Let us hope that the weather joins in the celebrations!

The Parish Paths Partnership Group

The Parish Paths Partnership Group P3 group continues to walk the footpaths once a month in the parish and also using paths in neighbouring parishes to make a circular walk. The canal is very useful for making a circuit and the birds and wildlife are very busy along its course now that Spring has arrived.

During January the group walked from Wellfield Farm in Lyneal to Northwood along a well maintained path with only a couple of minor problems with stiles. Unfortunately once across the border all trace of paths vanished and the group had to improvise to reach Bettisfield and the canal back home!

On the last day of February the group walked from Welshampton across the Crimps to Ellesmere, partaking of a cup of tea while searching for a lost member. We were wondering if some wandering female had proposed marriage to him!! Many thanks Andrew for the tea. The day was sunny and left us all looking forward to lots of walking during the coming months.

Whilst enjoying our monthly walks we make notes of any path and stile problems. If time permits we cut back any overgrowth and tack on directional arrows to stiles. Any major problems are reported to Shropshire Council. Some of us also use the brushcutter and hooks to clear brambles, saplings and nettles where a path has become very overgrown. This is usually where a path is quite narrow and difficult to walk.

......was formerly known as Ellesmere Infolink on Wharf Road and is now providing services in Ellesmere Library on Victoria Street.


"Dear residents.
