Hello and welcome....

.....to the first newsletter from your 'new' Parish Council. The 'old' Parish Council served for somewhat longer than usual due to the dates being moved because of the establishment of the Unitary Shropshire Council. However, to form the Parish Council an election was not necessary as there were no other candidates than those existing seven Parish Councillors who chose to put themselves forward. This now means that Welshampton ward is under-represented by two Councillors and so we now move forward to a co-opting situation, and there is more about this in the article herewith. You will recall that in the last newsletter we explained that the precept for the year 2013/14 was being increased by a sum of money to cover the cost of an election, in the event of one being necessary. As suggested before, this money is now being held in the Parish Council reserves account for the Councillors to decide in due course what course of action to take.

Enclosed with this newsletter you will find a copy of the Annual Parish Report 2012/13 in which you will read that Richard Hall decided not to stand again as a Councillor and so on behalf of the community, we thank Richard for his significant contribution to the Parish Council during the 15 years he has represented Welshampton.

At the first Parish Council meeting held after the start of the new term, the Councillors voted for me to continue as Chairman, which I am happy and privileged to be, but did point out that it really is time for someone else to step forward!

I hope you find that this newsletter achieves its objective ofkeeping you informed.

Help create a Welshampton calendar!


As part of the Celebrations we are printing a calendar for the village which I hope everyone will enter with a photograph of people, places or past events to make a very interesting calendar of village life.

Community **Champions**

Now that Spring has finally arrived it may be easy to forget the prolonged snow, ice, extreme cold and flooding of this past winter. Shropshire Council (together with other agencies such as NHS, Age UK, Shropshire Rural Community Council, Keep Shropshire Warm and the Department of Health) is encouraging local residents to become Community Champions who will act as a first point of contact to help out older and people vulnerable in their community.

This may involve monitoring weather reports (with advance warning of severe conditions given Shropshire Council) ensuring that the person you are concerned about has enough food, oil, topped-up electricity card, warm clothes, has remembered to collect prescriptions, etc. to get through a prolonged period of adverse weather. Practical help like snowclearing and regular checks by phone or in person may also be needed.

Are you willing to be co-opted as a **Parish Councillor?**

In the recent local council community. elections on 2 May 2013 no poll was held in Welshampton and Lyneal Parish because only 7 nominations were received for the Parish Councillor vacant positions. Ruth Evans. Peter Gee. Caroline Hamilton and Sarah Jefferies for Welshampton Ward and Lawrence Houghton MBE, Chris Symes and Martin Withington for Lyneal Ward were elected unopposed.

Therefore the Parish Council needs to fill the remaining 2 positions for Welshampton Ward by co-option. This means that, rather than the electorate voting for a Councillor, the Parish Councillors will vote as individuals for the candidate they believe will fulfil the role to the benefit of the

Candidates will still have to meet the legal qualifications and any person interested should apply in writing to the Clerk expressing their formal interest in the position. It is recommended that the includes а short personal background and explains why they have applied to become Councillor.

Prospective candidates should note that the term of office is to 2017, the date of the next round of Ordinary Parish Council elections. The deadline for applications is Friday 19 July 2013.

Distraction Burglaries

In the last few weeks a resident in Cockshutt was the victim of a 'distraction burglary'. This type of crime is very distressing to the victim and some can take a long time to recover confidence in answering the door to strangers.

As a reminder, it is not always someone pretending to be 'from the Electricity Company'. It can be someone asking for your help needing to make a telephone call, loosing a ball in your garden, needing a drink or pen and paper for example. The best advice is to assist them through a closed door or alternatively, call a friend or neighbour to come and assist.

Distraction burglars often work in teams, where one will distract you while the other looks for wallets, purses etc. Remember. don't keep large quantities of cash at home, always put it in the bank where it is safe.

Finally, if you're not sure who is at your door, don't open it.

Update on Connecting **Shropshire Project**

On Friday 31 May, Shropshire Council, BT and BDUK (Broadband Delivery UK, part of the Dept Media and Support) Culture, formally launched the project to deliver superfast broadband (defined as next generation access (NGA) with speeds in excess of 24Mbps) to 93% of properties in Shropshire. The remaining 7% will receive a minimum of 2Mbps. The whole project will be delivered by Spring 2016.

The project comprises of 9 Phases with work already started on Phase 1. The initial phases will cover assessing the existing network, agreeing and planning when new equipment will be placed inside exchanges, planning where the new fibre optic cables, cabinets and over around equipment will go. At the March Local Joint Committee Meeting the Parish Hall Committee were successful with their Grant Application and have received just over £1,300 towards new curtains and blinds for the Hall. Then, in May Ellesmere Round Table donated £250 towards the replacement of the Boiler. The Committee is aware that the Boiler needs replacing urgently and this will be done within the next couple of months. This is only the start of a programme of replacements and repairs the Committee is keen to carry out. To make sure the plan covers everything you, the hirers and users of the Hall consider important, there is a survey enclosed with the newsletter. Some sad news.... due to increasing work commitments, both John and Rachel Pittaway have had to stand down from the

Shropshire Council's new Road Safety Policy

In February this year, The R Shropshire Council approved a councils new Road Safety Policy. This schemes replaces a number of policies and support also involves town and parish Councils councils in a more active way.

In summary, the new policy will Shropshire Council. result in

- An annual programme of schemes rather than a defined lists of schemes for forthcoming years;
- More flexibility for appropriate measures on a site by site basis;
- A consistent approach countywide;
- A requirement to demonstrate community support; and
- The opportunity to use local funding.

The key change is that parish councils can now suggest schemes providing they have the support of the community. Councils will have the opportunity to submit up to 5 road safety concerns, 3 times a year to Shropshire Council.

Do you have concern about road safety in the Parish? Please let a Councillor or the Clerk know! Recently, a resident brought the Parish Council's attention to the area at Sansaw Cottages, Newton and this is being investigated.

Your Parish Council will also be reviewing those roads which it has previously brought to Shropshire Council's attention and ensure they are on the 'list' for consideration.

Rural Health Survey
