Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held on Wednesday 23 September 2015, at Welshampton Parish Hall, starting at 7pm

107/15 Election of Chair of the Council

Cllr. Hamilton had tendered her resignation as chairman and as a councillor. Nominations for the chair of the council were invited. Cllr. Haydon was proposed by Cllr. Wright and seconded by Cllr. Symes. It was resolved unanimously to elect Cllr. Haydon.

108/15 Chair's Declaration of Acceptance of Office

Cllr. Haydon signed his declaration of acceptance of office, duly witnessed by the Clerk.

109/15 Election of Vice Chairman

Nominations were invited for Vice Chairman. Cllr. Symes was proposed by Cllr. Wright and seconded by Cllr. Haydon. It was resolved unanimously to elect Cllr. Symes.

110/15 Public Participation Period

PC Crump and CSO Walker were present to discuss parish concerns regarding speeding. A number of members of the public and councillors raised concerns. Speeding is of great concern to parishioners and is a priority in the Parish Plan. It was felt that it is only a matter of time before there is a fatality. It was reported that there are issues with vehicles, including motorbikes, doing speeds of circa 100mph and overtaking dangerously on both the eastern and western approaches to Welshampton on the A495, on the Balmer Road and at the Breadon Crossroads. Problems with vehicles speeding up as they exit 30mph zones were reported. HGVs/cars travelling along the narrow stretch of road between the Welshampton Road to the Wem Road (just before Northwood) were reported, including concerns for safety of pedestrians walking from the campsite to The Sun Inn. Issues with lorries travelling through Welshampton were also reported. Noise from motorbikes, without legal silencers was also reported.

PC Crump said that the police recognise the issue but it is an issue that all town and parish councils have and therefore it is difficult to police all areas; the police prioritise 30/40mph zones. He said that people are being trained to use a speed laser gun and that this could be used in the parish. He advised that hand held guns have been used for monitoring in the past but he did not know if the Safer Roads Partnership had done monitoring in the area. The Parish Council asked for increased speed monitoring and more rigorous policing. The Parish Council also wanted to explore the possibility of starting a Community Speed Watch scheme, as the parish had previously. The Parish Council wanted to explore the possibility of a 40mph buffer zone; PC Crump advised that this needed to be done through Shropshire Council Highways. Councillor Williams said he would ask Dave Bradwell for statistics on fatalities in the parish.

A member of the public spoke in relation to application 15/0514/DIS and thanked the council for continuing to monitor progress. The resident was extremely concerned that although the site had been occupied since March there is very slow progress in fulfilling the planning conditions. The member of the public intended to put this concern to the North Shropshire Planning Committee. The clerk was asked to enquire as to Shropshire Council's process for ensuring planning conditions are fulfilled.
