## **Welshampton School Clock**



How many people have noticed the School Clock when they drive, walk, bike or ride by the School? The Clock has a special history.

Back in 1977 it was agreed Welshampton Village would celebrate Queen Elizabeth's Silver Jubilee with a whole day of events. The Village Hall Committee agreed to organise the day and a house to house

collection was carried out to raise funds to pay for the entertainment.

The celebrations, which took place on the field opposite the Hall, included races and dancing for the children and a giant tea party. Six donkeys were collected from Rhyl sands and local young jockeys rode them in a donkey derby. Local publican, Fred Wainwright ran the 'book' with both winners and losers. The event of the day was a pram race with a pusher and large and small 'babies' on board. The day culminated with a dance in the old hall and 150 dancers saw the day to its end. After all the celebrations there were funds left over. A Clock to remember the Silver Jubilee day was purchased with silver livery and two small plagues.

The Clock was erected by Keith Egerton later that year and he has continued to look after it over the 41 years since. It has been calculated that Keith has climbed onto the school roof more than 250 times to re-set the time when it stops or move it on or back as required. Keith has now had to retire from this role on family advice. The Clock has now been updated with an automatic control so no-one has to climb on the roof! It is hoped that community involvement with the Clock will continue through

# Lyneal Trust and Tesco Bags of Help

For those who do not know, Lyneal Trust provides holidays and canal day trips for disabled and vulnerable people and their family, friends and carers. Last year over 2,000 mainly local people enjoyed a holiday or day trip which normally they are not able to experience.

# Annual Parish Meeting

This year's Parish Meeting to be held on Wednesday 10 April at 7pm in the Parish Hall will have a special speaker, local resident George Rook. George will be telling us about his work with Shropshire Telford and Wrekin Dementia Action Alliance to raise awareness of living with this condition. # Parish Council Budget

Soon you will receive the Council Tax Demand from Shropshire Council which includes elements destined for other public bodies including the Parish Council. You will notice that the Parish Council has increased its Precept (the official name for the amount of tax paid through the Council Tax).

Raising the Precept is never an easy decision but having discussed plans for the next financial year over several meetings the Council considered that to fulfil its role it had to raise the Precept to £21,500. The average Band D tax payer's Parish Council component will be £58.14 per annum and equates to £1.12 per week. This is an increase of £3.57 per annum or 8p per week.

The Council is planning to continue its work exploring the Parish heritage and part of the increase will go towards those projects.

Being a councillor is a rewarding form of public service that puts you in a unique position where you can make decisions about local issues and improve the quality of life for people within Welshampton and Lyneal Parish. It gives you the opportunity to help your local community and be part of a dedicated team influencing and providing key services for your area.

The councillor's role takes in:

- Representing the parish ward
- Decision making
- Policy and strategy review and development
- Community leadership and engagement

Being an effective councillor requires some work. The primary role of a councillor is to represent their ward and the people who live in it. Community Leadership is at the heart of modern local government and councils are taking on new responsibilities for working in partnership with other organisations, including Shropshire Council and the voluntary and community sector, to improve services and the quality of life for citizens.

## Shropshire's Great Outdoors Annual Public Survey

Shropshire's Great Outdoors Strategy 2018-28 sets out the strategic direction for the management and development of publicly accessible greenspace, rights of way and other access in the unitary authority area of Shropshire, aiming to inspire action to improve health, prosperity and happiness by cherishing Shropshire's great outdoors. The strategy fulfils the statutory requirement of a rights of way improvement plan, but broadens the remit to deliver across multiple policy areas and to integrate activity across local authority services and partner organisations.

To help define their services Shropshire Council undertake an annual user satisfaction survey. They would like to hear from you, even if you don't use rights of way, parks, play areas or countryside sites, so they can understand what the barriers to participation are. It will only take 10 minutes.
