
Please come along if you have ideas or expertise, or if you fancy joining a regular group of people to pursue projects in our area.

Colemere

Parish Councillors recently raised concerns with Shropshire Council around maintenance and management of Colemere Heritage Site. As a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and also a UNESCO Ramsar site, its important and delicate ecological balance is something to be celebrated and protected.

A productive meeting was held between several Parish Councillors and Shropshire Council officers. where protection of the whole site was discussed: including the diverse meadows surrounding the mere. Shropshire Council reported that accessibility progress will be made in October to extend the boardwalk further and to improve the footpaths. Funding for the protection and maintenance of the site is extremely limited, and it agreed that Shropshire Council would investigate the possibility of external funding, and potentially car park charges (for visitors from outside the local area) to raise finances for much needed signage and fencing.

We discussed the need for much better signage around the whole site, and the need for education of visitors to ensure that dogs are kept on leads, that litter and dog fouling bins are utilised, and precious nesting sites protected. Suggestions were made to engage local schools and Duke of Edinburgh students in educational visits and programmes.

Concerns were raised around overflow from the canal into Colemere, and how measures might be implemented to prevent any ecological damage occurring from excessive overflow. Shropshire Council shared that an investigation into a possible rare European eel population is something that they would like to undertake.

Follow up meetings will be arranged, and focus will be on progressing funding, signage and education initially.



Welshampton Church of England Primary School

As part of the energy MOT, one of the friendly Keep Shropshire Warm advisors will inspect your home for any 'major faults' and 'advisories', check your energy usage and offer solutions before the colder months arrive.

They will also fit free, low-cost energy saving measures and answer any questions you have – big or small.
