Welshampton Verges

We have taken advice from Marches Meadow Group and the Restoring Shropshire Verges Project and hope to restore some of our verges from very short mown grass to lovely wildflower havens for wildlife very soon. We will ensure that visibility is maintained at junctions and may mow the edges of verges for safety. Swish on Saturday 8 July 2023!

Welshampton and Lyneal Parish Council through its Working Group on Climate, Sustainability and Biodiversity would like to tell you more about their forthcoming SWISH event. Some of you will know the word Swish; others will never have heard of it! It's a Clothes Swap, a fancy clothes swap at that! Or maybe you might liken it to a bring and buy. Whatever, if you come you will surely take home something you will want to wear in exchange for something you will never wear ever again.

Please bring women's, men's and children's clothes including accessories, for example shoes, hats, fine scarves, bags, belts and fashion jewellery. Items should be dropped off at the Parish Hall in Welshampton between 9am and 12 noon. Items should be clean and in good or better than good condition. They really need to be the things that you would never throw away because they are too good but that you know are just languishing in your wardrobe. We all know that situation. Oh and no underwear please! To help us organise the clothing on the day please bring hangers with each item. You will be able to take other hangers away later in the day.

Tokens will be exchanged for items brought to the Parish Hall with an additional token being given for any 'designer' items brought in. So, five items brought in two of which are designer items would result in 7 tokens.

As items are delivered they will be sorted appropriately and then the Swish will begin at 2pm. No tokens can be exchanged for clothes/accessories until after 2.30pm to give everyone the opportunity to browse. One token per item save for designer which will require two.

If you wish to attend but haven't dropped any items in during the morning then that will be perfectly fine provided an entrance fee of £6 is paid and for which you will receive one token. For everyone else dropping off clothes and accessories in the morning there will be a nominal entrance fee of £2 to help cover the costs of hiring the Parish Hall and afternoon tea and cakes on the day.

Severn Hospice are our chosen charity for this event. Any items not claimed will go to Severn Hospice in Ellesmere.

The Seven "R's" of Sustainability: Reduce, reuse, recycle, rethink, refuse, repair, repurpose. This is precisely what this day is about. We will be helping our Carbon footprint enormously if we can make this day the success that it should be. It will in addition be fun and enjoyable for all. Please do come and join us.
