The Lyneal Trust — can you help one of our local charities?

The Lyneal Trust exists to offers canal boat and cottage holidays and canal day trips for people with disabilities, illness or injury, or any other vulnerability and their family, friends and carers who may accompany them. You may have walked or driven by the Trust's site at Lyneal Wharf and seen the boats and cottages.

The Trust held an 'Open Day' in April and 34 people, both local and further afield, visited the Wharf. Some came forward to volunteer and others took the opportunity to look around the boats and cottages. So far this year, the Trust's band of volunteers has been increased by over 20 people!

The Trust has seen a change in trustees recently with Sarah Lamb joining and Steve Bristow resigning due to a change in family circumstances. Sarah's interest is working with people and a variety of organisations to improve and establish new accessible places. Sarah is already contributing to the Trust with ideas on how to improve our facilities.

Those of you who use social media, Facebook in particular, and follow the Trust will know what a super job Steve has done in creating Lyneal Trust's online presence. So there is now an opportunity for a volunteer to manage the Trust's social media

programme. Can you do it? Or do you have a family member or friend who enjoys the Facebook experience who would like to get involved?

In addition, the Trust has a vacancy for a grant fund-raiser. This is an administrative role which can be done at home. Whilst Lyneal Trust is self-funding, it relies on grants and donations when major wharf facilities improvements or boat replacement are required.

Parish Council Retains 'Quality Gold'

As Karen Bland mentioned in her introduction to the previous 'Keeping YOU Informed', the Parish Council has retained its 'Quality Gold' under the national Local Council Award Scheme (LCAS). The Council is the first council in Shropshire to not only achieve but retain this standard. But what is the Award Scheme?

LCAS celebrates the successes of the very best local councils, and provides a framework to support all local councils, town and parish, to meet their full potential. All local councils want to serve their local communities and make a real difference to the lives of the people that live there. LCAS offers councils the opportunity to show that they meet the standards set by the sector, assessed by their peers, and to put in place the conditions for continued improvement. Councils can apply for an award at one of three levels.

- The Foundation Award demonstrates that a council meets requirements for operating lawfully and according to standard practice.
- The Quality Award demonstrates that a council achieves good practice in governance, community engagement and council improvement.
- The Quality Gold Award demonstrates that a council is at the forefront of best practice and achieves excellence in governance, community leadership and council development.

In March 2023, the Parish Council submitted its application to be re-accredited as 'Quality Gold'. In its report the Accreditation Panel stated: "The Accreditation Panel would like to thank Councillors Stringer, Bland and Holland and Carole Warner, your Clerk for the excellent presentation and response to questions raised. The Panel commend the Council once again on the high, professional standard that it has maintained which they considered was even of a higher standard than that of four years ago. It is evident from the Council's extensive list of achievements, particularly on their engagement with the community, as

demonstrated in the presentation, that it is passionate about the work it does. Of note was the professionalism, enthusiasm and commitment to team working. The commitment to training, ongoing professional development and programme of self-review of the Council's performance was commendable, and it was also good to hear of the successful induction process for new councillors that the Clerk had put in place.

The Panel was particularly impressed with the way that the Council has built on its achievements from the previous Quality Gold Award."

Community Grants advance warning!

Every year the Parish Council puts aside an amount of funds to help local community groups. There are agreed criteria and an application form which can be obtained from the Clerk.

Completed applications must be submitted by Friday 1 December and will be considered at the December Parish Council meeting. All applications will be considered on their individual merits.

Missing Post Box at The Sun

Early August, the post box located at the car park entrance of The Sun disappeared! The metal post had perished and was no longer able to support the Post Box.

The Parish Council has been advised that the latest thinking of Royal Mail is to re-locate it to the layby by the Parish Hall. This would allow safer parking on the public highway. The new location is still to be confirmed.

The Parish Council understands it may take 25 weeks before the post box is back in action.

Do we need street lights on between midnight and 5pm?

Residents have recently approached the Parish Council about the timing of its street lights. All street lights in Welshampton and Lyneal are owned and maintained by the Parish Council.

It may be possible, if the light is located in an area which does not impact road safety, to switch them off between midnight and 5am.

If you live near a light which you would be happy to be switched off between these times, please contact the Council's Clerk.

£11m available to help lift Shropshire homes out of fuel poverty

Energy experts at Shropshire Council have secured over £11 million in funding for its Sustainable Warmth Programme to assist local people to improve their homes and reduce harm caused by fuel poverty. The total funding award of £11,073,500 from the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero forms part of the Government's Phase 2 of its 'Home Upgrade Grant' scheme.

Shropshire Council will use the funding to help retrofit the homes of residents living off-gas. Fully funded works will include insulation, heat pumps, first-time double glazing, and solar panels.

As well as keeping homes cosy and warm, energy efficiency improvements can reduce heating costs and carbon emissions. They can also boost comfort levels at home, and protect against the health risks associated with damp and cold homes.

Shropshire Council is now inviting expressions of interest from residents and landlords to the

Sustainable Warmth Programme. Qualifying residents will receive a free assessment to identify the types of measures that will be most effective for their home. All works will be delivered by accredited and Shropshire Council approved contractors.

This new funding will allow Shropshire Council to support more than 500 households over the next two years, and it is currently negotiating additional funding to increase the number of households who will benefit from the scheme.
